- A. The “traditional” **Snorri six-week Icelandic Immersion Program** for young adults (beginning at age 18 through approximately 30 years);

Please Note: Applicants for scholarship aid for either of the two **Snorri programs for the summer of 2012** should also apply directly to Snorri **before their January, 2012 deadline** and indicate that you are from the **Chicago area**. (Both of these Snorri programs are summarized in the above-mentioned Scholarship Program Chair’s Report.)

- B. The more recent two-week **Snorri-Plus Program** for mature adults and retirees (beginning at approximately 30 years of age);
- C. Any bona fide adult education, college, or graduate level **course(s)**, **interim/summer study program**, or **independent-study project** in the United States, Canada, or Iceland relevant to Iceland and matters Icelandic.
